MINUTES Regular Session Nacogdoches City Council May 5, 2015 – 5:30 p.m. City Council Room – City Hall 202 E. Pilar Street



Regular Session:

Those Present:

Mayor Roger Van Horn; Council members Shelley Brophy, Roy Boldon, Mike Keller and David Norton; City Manager Jim Jeffers, and City Secretary Lila Fuller.

1. Call to Order.

Mayor Van Horn at 5:30 p.m. A quorum was established.

2. <u>PRESENTATIONS AND RECOGNITIONS</u>: Receive presentation on 2015 Texas Book Festival Grant for the Judy B. McDonald Public Library.

Mercedes Franks, library director, gave a brief presentation on the grant received from the Texas Book Festival in the amount of \$1,500 that would be used to expand the eBooks collection in an effort to reach underserved populations such as the Spanish-speaking adults and reluctant young adult readers.

Councilmember Boldon congratulated Mercedes for their efforts in the adult technology area, and Mayor Van Horn recognized the creative ideas and programs that the library staff offered.

General Mike Butcko appeared representing the American Red Cross and read a letter thanking the City of Nacogdoches for again giving the Red Cross a visible presence in Nacogdoches by their help in establishing an office in City Hall. He stated the Red Cross had been serving Nacogdoches since 1917 and thanked the City Council and staff for their support.

Approved as presented.

Council member Brophy moved to approve the consent agenda as presented. The motion was seconded by Council member Boldon and unanimously passed.

REGULAR AGENDA:

5. Consider authorizing the City of Nacogdoches to participate in the Texas Enterprise Zone Program by adoption of a resolution providing tax incentives, designating a liaison for communication with the interested parties, and nominating Pilgrim's Pride to the Economic Development and Tourism Division of the Governor's Office through the economic development bank as a Texas Enterprise Project.

Larissa Philpot, city planner, appeared stating Pilgrim's Pride had requested to participate in the enterprise zone program requiring the City of Nacogdoches to serve as sponsor. She stated they were proposing a \$38 million investment to expand a new line

of product requiring new equipment and rail spur improvements. She stated 125 new employees would be hired and 375 current employees retained through the project. As part of the program, Pilgrim's Pride would get a rebate of State sales and use taxes. Philpot stated adoption of the resolution would authorize the City's submission of an application to the State on behalf of Pilgrim's Pride.

John Thomason with Pilgrim's Pride reviewed the proposed project which would move the processing plant to a more commercial product requiring larger birds. He stated the decision by the company to invest in the Nacogdoches Plant reflected well on the Nacogdoches community.

The City Council asked questions of Mr. Thomason regarding hardships in hiring workers. He stated they were excited to be working with Goodwill on a new training program that would allow workers who were part of the Goodwill program to attain employment and benefits through their company.

Council member Keller moved to authorize the City of Nacogdoches to participate in the Texas Enterprise Zone Program by adoption of a Resolution providing tax incentives, designating a liaison for communication with the interested parties, and nominating Pilgrim's Pride to the Economic Development and Tourism Division of the Governor's Office through the economic development bank as a Texas Enterprise Project. The motion was seconded by Council member Norton and unanimously passed. (Resolution No. 1176-5-15)

6. Consider ordinance to abandon and quit claim the unused and unusable reserved utility easement crossing Lots 1 and 2 of the Camila Subdivision south of Loop 224.

Steve Bartlett, city engineer, explained that in platting the Camila Subdivision south of Loop 224 in the City it was discovered that an unused thirty-foot (30') wide utility easement cut through the property. The easement was reserved at the time Wicker Street was abandoned, but Wicker Street was never constructed. The reserved Utility Easement predates Loop 224 and is unused by a utility. Further, it is located in a way that no utility would want to use such easement and impairs the appropriate location of a proposed home across these lots.

Council member Norton moved to adopt an ordinance to abandon and quit claim the unused and unusable reserved utility easement crossing Lots 1 and 2 of the Camila Subdivision south of Loop 224. The motion was seconded by Council member Keller and unanimously passed. (Ordinance No. 1697-5-15)

7. Consider two (2) appointments to the Main Street Advisory Board to fill vacancies.

Council member Brophy moved to table the appointments to the Main Street Advisory Board until July when other board appointments are made. The motion was seconded by Council member Boldon and unanimously passed.

8. Receive budget presentation.

City Manager Jeffers gave a brief presentation on budget opportunities in the 2015 budget and beyond.

The City Council responded that they must find a way to responsibly find more revenue to meet budget needs in the future.


As of March 31, 2015, the City of Nacogdoches had a total of \$5 million in non-interest bearing NOW Accounts at Regions Bank, \$42.2 million invested in Money Market accounts earning a contracted rate of 0.55%, and \$1.4 million in a Fidelity Money Market Escrow account earning a rate of 0.01%. The City's average yield for FY15 is 0.27%.

The City did not have any money invested in Treasuries, Bonds, or other investments with a stated maturity date.



MEETING DATE: May 11, 2015

DESCRIPTION: This property was originally zoned R-1 in 1970. The property owners received a

rezoning to B-1 in 1995, citing wishes to develop the property for commercial

purposes.

The properties on the southwest and northwest corners of the intersection are zoned B-1. The properties on the northeast corner and the properties to the southeast of the subject property are zoned R-1, single family residential.

The zoning ordinance describes B-1 local business districts as an area intended to accommodate those business activities supplying the day-to-day commercial needs of nearby residents. The types and intensities of uses allowed in this district are limited so as to not adversely affect neighborhing residential areas. B-1 districts are also sometimes referred to as neighborhood commercial districts. The ordinance describes B-2 general business districts as an area where business activities are geared toward the automobile. Generally B-2 districts are located along major traffic arteries where strip business develops.

The distinction between the existing zoning of the property (B-1 local business) and the requested zoning (B-2 general business) is the potential negative impact on the adjacent residential properties. The B-2 district is more inclusive, and allows a wider range of uses. Noise, truck traffic, and typical daily vehicle traffic are all items which influence if a use is permitted in a B-2 district, but not in a B-1 district. A comparison of land uses permitted in each district is attached. Land uses which are not permitted in either district were deleted from the chart. The uses which are permitted in one district but not in the other, or require a specific use permit in one district are highlighted.

The applicant has purchased the property, and wishes to construct a donut shop on the property. A donut shop is permitted under the current B-1 zoning, as an "eating place w/o drive-thru," but a drive through would not be permitted. The applicant has indicated they are applying for the zone change so that the donut shop may be constructed with a drive through.

A zoning change to B-2 General Business would represent spot zoning. Spot zoning is the application of zoning to a specific area that is not applied to the larger neighborhood. It provides unjustified privileges for that area the other properties are not granted, and privileges that may be

detrimental to the other properties in the area. Spot zoning can be avoided, by increasing the area of a rezoning. In this case, the intersection is zoned B-1 local business. Rezoning one corner to B-2 gives the owner of that one corner unjustified privileges not granted to the remaining B-1 zoned properties. If the city feels B-2 zoning is appropriate for this property, then rezoning of the entire intersection should be considered, under a separate request.

RECOMMENDED

ACTION:

The property owner and building contractor appeared at the Planning and Zoning Commission meeting to represent the request. No one spoke in favor of or in opposition to the request.

Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the request with a 3 to 1 vote. The commission directed staff to initiate a rezoning of the other properties at the intersection at the June Planning and Zoning meeting to address the spot zoning issue.

Conditions for approval to be considered (staff comments are underlined):

- (1) Compatibility. The specific use will be compatible with and not injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity, nor significantly diminish or impair property values within the immediate vicinity.

 Changing the zoning of this property to B-2 general business has the potential to negatively impact the adjacent residential property.
- (2) Orderly growth and development. The establishment of the specific use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property.
 - The only surrounding vacant property is the residentially zoned property to the east. Changing the zoning of this property to B-2 general business has the potential to discourage residential development of these lots.
- (3) Supporting facilities. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary supporting facilities have been or will be provided.

 Adequate supporting facilities already exist for the property, or can be provided with existing city policies.
- (4) Drives and parking. The design, location and arrangement of all driveways and parking spaces provided for the safe and convenient movement of vehicular and

pedestrian traffic without adversely affecting the general public or adjacent developments.

The properties currently do not have a paved driveway. Future driveways and curb cuts must be approved by the City. The City's access management guidelines require separation between other driveways and intersections, meaning a future driveway at this location would likely be permitted only on the far eastern side of the lot on Stallings Drive, or on the far southern side of the lot on Woden Road.

- (5) Nuisances. Adequate nuisance-prevention measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, and vibration.

 Any future development must adhere to ordinance regulations regarding performance standards which do not permit offense odor, fumes, dust, noise or vibrations at levels that are a nuisance to adjacent property owners. An important difference between B-1 and B-2 permitted land uses is the limitation on uses that could produce noise or odor in B-1 districts.
- (6) Lighting. Any lighting to be provided will be directional so as not to disturb or adversely affect neighboring properties. The city's lighting ordinance will apply.
- (7) Landscaping. Sufficient landscaping and screening to ensure harmony and compatibility with adjacent properties exists or will be provided.

 The city's landscaping ordinance will apply. Street trees will be required along the Stallings and Woden Road street frontages. A solid screening fence and a 6 foot wide landscaped buffer will be required between the commercially zoned property and the residentially zoned property.
- (8) Comprehensive plan. The proposed use is in accordance with the comprehensive plan.

The comprehensive plan recommends commercial development for this intersection. The comprehensive plan's future land use map doesn't differentiate between B-1 and B-2 commercial uses.




