NEA Big Read Nacogdoches: First Week's Schedule

(Nacogdoches, TX) – The month-long celebration of NEA Big Read Nacogdoches begins October 1st and runs through October 30th. The Nacogdoches Public Library is leading the community-wide reading of the book, *Station Eleven* by Emily St. John Mandel. However, several groups and organizations are also partnering with the public library to bring book discussions and book-themed events throughout the city.

Free copies of the book were funded through the National Endowment for the Arts Big Read grant in conjunction with Arts Midwest. Customers may still pick-up a free book at the public library. Copies of the book are also available for check-out in digital, print, and audio form. The purpose of the NEA Big Read Nacogdoches is to bring the community together through the shared experience of reading the same book and then discussing and experiencing the book through art, poetry, learning new skills, and playing together in a variety of locations, including the public library. Books evoke a variety of emotions and opinions that are different for each person. October's events will feature events specifically for families, some for adults, and some for teens.
